Strengths

Spring Harbor offers a small school environment where everyone knows everybody. Our leadership team works hard to create school improvement goals that keep the student at the center of our work – ensuring that students leave Spring Harbor with the right habits, skills and mindset to transition successfully to high school.

Progress

Through a focus on reflective practices and strengthening relationships within our school community, SHMS saw an increase in proficiency levels in reading and math; and 81%-82% of our families reported school strengths in family engagement and relationships respectively.

Area for Growth

Staff will spend the next year examining practices to ensure that all students are provided equitable access to engaging curriculum – using an inquiry-based process and project-based learning that supports and reinforces MMSD graduate pillars of growth mindset, creative problem-solving, cultural awareness, confidence, interpersonal skills, and wellness.

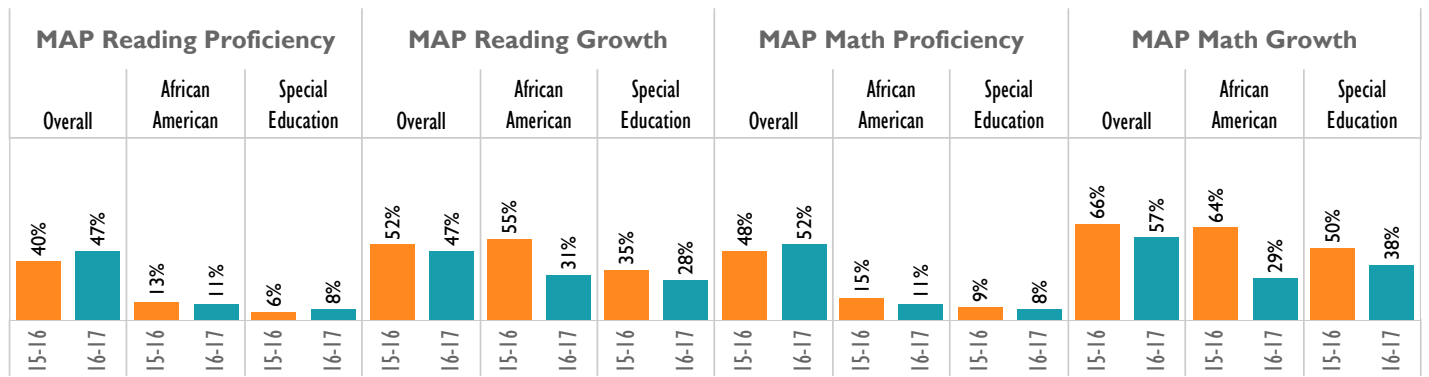

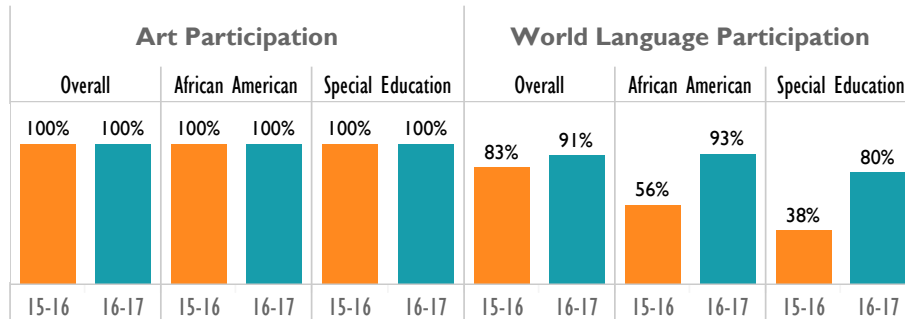
